NEWBURY CLEARANCE WORK STARTING NOW!

The route of the proposed Newbury Bypass, Berkshire, is set for imminent trashing - unless we ALL stop it. The pro - roads lobby such as the British Roads Federation, are spending vast amounts of time and money campaigning FOR the road. Stakes are high, success for them means any opposition to their plans can ultimately be ignored. In stopping them, the power of the road lobby would be destroyed. Some of the most beautiful and important land left in this country would also be saved.

The campaign against the bypass has experienced a major legal setback as the EC dropped 40 different complaints issued to them (still believe we live in a 'democracy'?). However, one last legal hope is that the road will be shelved due to cuts in the budget (November 28th). Unfortunately, clearance work on the route looks likely to start around the 6th - 8th November. People are desperately needed to stop this work. The contract is set to go to Costain. If you can't get to Newbury they've got an office near you! Go and occupy it. A Highways Agency source suggests that this "preliminary clearance" (trashing) contract is for £6m. Such contracts are never normally more than £0.5m. Looks like they're expecting trouble doesn't it?!

There are 7 camps along the route and they urgently need your support. If you've never been to a road protest camp before don't worry, just give the Third Battle of Newbury office a ring and talk to them. They are arranging regular training and route walks - go along! As well as people, equipment and money are desperately needed. Old marquees, blankets, CB radios, bikes, plastic sheeting, scaffolding, computers, camping stoves - anything you can think of! OPENCAST EVICTIONS

From Oct. 23 - 27, the joint longest eviction in the British Isles since World War 2 was contested between anti open cast protesters and 'Celtic Energy'. After months of the squatters blocking their corporate rape of the land, C.E. moved in to try and clear the site of all life. As they came in, every morning, they didn't anticipate the intense resistance to their no expenses spared operation. They made slow and expensive gain despite throwing loads of money, equipment, armies of veteran security, tooled up bailiffs and the scab climbers used at Stanworth. Small but beautifully formed, Brynhenllys' limited space saw concentrated struggle. The length and ferocity of the eviction was made by the human element : on the ground, in barricaded buildings and in the trees.

The first and second days saw site access contested effectively, although they eventually won through. Day two heated up with over 20 arrests, most were locals. Some security were nicked for sexually molesting children. Violence to pensioners, toddlers was obviously acceptable. Well barricaded and locked - in buildings took all day two to evict. They were re occupied and defended the next day.

Cherry pickers, chainsaw wielding bailiffs and £300 a day climbing scum took a while to be effective. On the first day, unwalkwayed and undefended trees were lost. Lessons were learnt. Progress was slow as every tree and walkway was defended : weight of numbers held back climbers. Some went for high tree sits, most stayed mobile re grouping to defend the next 'target'. Chainsaws were foiled by getting onto and around the branches. Un clipped protesters were harder to cherry pick - climbers were less ready to wrestle up high. Heavy S. Wales wind and rain helped out in confrontation as climbers bottled out of going up to 'unsafe' conditions. Days of exposure took toll on protesters. C.E. stranded people at the top of trees over night by cutting lower branches, denying food, shelter and other human rights whilst security got violent at night. As well as getting stuck in local campaigners, food and hospitality carried the campaign through these difficult times : the battle went on.

After 5 days the camp was overrun. Protesters have moved on to Selar to re group and prepare for future action. The lessons learnt at Brynhenllys will pay dividends at Selar which is under imminent eviction threat. There, we'll give them another welcome in the hillsides. ALL ON FOR WHATLEY

The mass Earth First! action at Whatley Quarry, Amey Roadstone Corporation's flag ship quarry in the Mendips, is set to bring together campaigners from all over the UK, and beyond. ARC wish to double the size of the quarry so that it is visible from the moon. A previous attempt to double the size of the quarry was blocked by John Gummer (Environment Minister) after a strong campaign. This major action will not only put ARC on the defensive, but also send shock waves into the aggregates industry. The planning application is also being fiercely opposed by local parish councils, the district council and Bath City Council.

On Sunday December 3rd we'll be planning actions and explaining the issues surrounding quarrying the Mendips. Turn up at midday. We'll be camping near the quarry (ring for location) so bring waterproofs, WARM clothes, tents, vehicles and anything else to make the day run smoothly. On Monday 4th we'll close down the quarry - this will be hectic so it is essential people attend on the Sunday to get clued up. Absolutely anyone (well almost... sorry M15 but we know who you are now) is welcome. This will be a great introduction for newcomers to direct action. EITHINOG MEADOWS

Eithinog Meadows in Bangor, Gwynedd, are still the main focus of attention for the Gwynedd EF! The area has been proposed for a development of executive housing, on a 30 acre wild flower and woodland site rich in wildlife, and for which there has been much public opposition. There was a small, wet, but successful five-day 'Land is Ours' occupation on the site in September to highlight the scheme. Other stunts this month included an office occupation of the headquarters of North Wales Housing Association in Llandudno where Gwynedd EF! held talks with the bods who are proposing this lunatic destruction. CARMEL WOODS

The 12 year battle to save Carmel Woods in the Gwenlais Valley from quarrying has finally been won. Wimpey Minerals have discarded plans for a limestone quarry at the site. Of course this is a result of the company's commitment to preserving such areas of outstanding ecological value - NOT!!! The plans were abandoned on the condition that local campaigner Pat Langford, dropped her High Court action contesting the planning permission for the existing quarry at Cilrychen. Although the validity of the Interim Development Order will never be tested in the courts, this has been heralded as an important victory for the conservation movement. The future of the woods, unique turlough lake and other SSSI's nearby has been safeguarded. Further threat comes from our old friends **Celtic Energy** whose proposed opencast site at Tir Dafydd could affect the hydrology of the turlough lake. WELLS ROAD

Twelve people opposing the Wells 'Relief' Road were arrested at an action on the site in September for Aggravated Trespass. Their case was due to be heard on 23 October, but has now been postponed until January, probably in order to dissuade them from protesting further until their cases get dropped. Due to the number of people now on bail, extra help is urgently needed. Also, an eviction order on the campaign squat has been thrown out by the High Court as the County Council failed in its duty to rehouse the children living there. FASLANE

Thirteen and a half year old Faslane Peace Camp in Dumbartonshire is feeling the sharp end of a clamp down on its activities through persecution from the 'authorities'. One example of this was the £500 fine imposed on a protester for fire-breathing at the south gate of the nuclear submarine base. The protester was originally charged with six counts of assault for this peaceful activity but eventually got convicted of a breach of the peace. The camp is fast running out of money to pay for these ludicrous court appearances. Please send some dosh. Meanwhile, the 'Alien' action in mid-October went off with a bang, and a future one day 'Hootenany' is taking place on 5 November with all sorts of creative workshops going on. MOTOR SHOW

Brrrrm, brrrrm; it's that time of year again to promote mass destruction of the planet through motor car use. On the 19th October, six people entered the Motor Show (London) undercover, and creatively disrupted the Global Motor Industry Conference. This was where all the top motor industry chiefs were gathered, cabinet minister Ian Laing, eventually had to be escorted out under police protection. On 25 October three people entered the show dropping banners on the display stands highlighting carnageddon. Other large demos within the show were prevented by a very large police presence who arrested people randomly. The final day on 29 October saw an action saying 'good riddance' for another year.

EVICCTIONS ALERT!

The residents of Holtsfield in Swansea, West Glamorgan, are due to be evicted and have their homes demolished at any moment. This small community was due to be evicted on October 18th; but 150 people turned away bailiffs. Certified bailiffs have now been appointed to carry out the eviction without prior notice. Property developer Tim Jones, has been refused planning permission to build executive mansions on the site. Nevertheless he intends to continue with his plans, making 43 people homeless in the process. Help needed soon. Phone 01792 234027 / 233596 / 234059.

The Kings Cross Women's Centre in London is facing eviction. Housewives in Dialogue (HinD), the charity running the centre, cannot afford the Community Housing Association's (CHA) demand for a

commercial rent of £6,000 per year. The CHA only paid £14,000 for the premises and stands to make a hefty profit. The centre's activities are essential at a time of cutbacks, growing poverty, racist attacks and sexual violence. A30 RELIEF ROAD

Three camps defending land in the path of the proposed A30 Relief Road near Exeter, Devon, are awaiting news of which consortium will win the contract to build the road. There are expected to be many companies involved with each consortium, so watch this space for info on who to target. Diggers (human ones) are required for the network of tunnels being prepared. THE LAND IS OURS

On October 7 and 8, The Land is Ours staged 'D-Day landings' in Oxford. Land annexed by Magdalen College was invaded by punts and rowing boats and reclaimed for public use. The demonstration was in protest at the college, which in the 1970's cut the route in two by building a moat across the water meadows. END THE ARMS TRADE.

The Campaign Against the Arms Trade (CAAT) held a Student and Youth gathering on October 21/22 at the University of Central Lancashire, Preston. The gathering ended stylishly with actions against British Aerospace (BAe) on the 23rd. CAAT also led a silent march and nonviolent sit down blockade of the Copex arms fayre on the 31st. For November 11th and 12th a weekend of actions are planned urging the Government to cancel the BAe contract to supply Hawk aircraft to Indonesia. By doing so, BAe are directly arming the Suharto dictatorship which rules Indonesia - the cause of mass genocide in East Timor. Info: 0171 281 4369.

THANET WAY

The campaign against the A299 at Thanet Way, Kent, continues despite increased police attention and arrests. One campaigner, Iggy, is now on remand and is soon due for sentencing with the prospect of being behind bars in the near future. Six people arrested at the mass trespass in July will go on trial at Canterbury Magistrates on Dec. 4th - 6th. They were arrested for conspiring to rave under section 63 CJA. Bail conditions put on these people have no relevance to their charge. There are 21 police witnesses? Where from?! A demonstration is planned for November 3 in support of Iggy. Reclaim the Streets!!

STREETS RECLAIMED

Manchester successfully reclaimed one of their main streets on Oct. 21st - highlighting the need for a pedestrianised system in the city centre. They were joined by Birmingham critical massers who cycled up through the Peak District - okay, they used the train too!

600 people danced and partied in the street until 5 pm to live bands and sound systems. Then, proceeding to Albert Square, they raved until morning. Police presence was low, although the 'fat controller' did threaten the sound system. Quick cuffs were used on a man whose lorry blocked the way. Apart from this, a great success.

500 people joyfully blocked one of Bristol's main (and poshest) streets on October 28th. The police were powerless to act as they partied to the pedal-powered "Rinky Dink" sound system, a bizarre brass band, a celdih and a Children's puppet show. The desire to play has returned...

M65, LANCASHIRE

There have been no more actions since the demolition of the barn in the route of the M65 at Guide, Blackburn. The Stanworth Valley eviction cases have been adjourned until January 22nd and other court cases are still in progress. Court action against Tarmac, Group 4 and the DoT for assaults committed early in 1994 are progressing despite the defendants' noncooperation. They have failed to deliver witness statements and as a result the trial has been postponed until next year to give them more time - they've had a year, how much more time do they need? WYNDHAM HILL

Yet again, Wyndham Hill in Yeovil, Somerset is under threat from the developers. This time a 'relief road' has been tagged onto the back of a massive shopping development proposed by a Scottish company, Peastons. If this development is given the green light it will mean the destruction of Riverside Walk, a green area used by people of all ages. The woodland habitat of the area contains mature oak, ash and beech trees and supports a great diversity of animals including badgers, bats, owls and, at present, an egret.

The road, which is estimated to solve traffic problems for only 10 years, will cut through the east side of the hill. The lower slopes are also to be developed, leaving only the very top untouched. NO DERBY BYPASS

Actions have started again at the A564 Derby Bypass after a quiet summer. On October 6th a Tarmac board meeting was combined with a meeting of their "Environmental Advisory Panel" (!) Protesters greeted them and 15 people successfully stopped a concrete pour. The Board members' tour of the route was diverted, avoiding an unplanned rendezvous with digger divers. Activists had previously refused to attend this greenwash exercise with Sir John Banham, Chairman of Tarmac. He told two of them he planned to plant trees next to the completed road! Sir JB was hurt when his offer of lunch was turned down. The fact that Tarmac has an "Environmental Advisory Panel" and that the Chairman of the board of directors attempted to placate protesters is a sure sign that they are running scared. LEEDS OPEN CAST

The campaign against opencast mining in West Yorkshire is continuing. RESIDENTS AGAINST THE M74

Glasgow City Council have given the go - ahead for a TEN LANE motorway cutting through the south side of the city. The aim is to cut the present route by ten minutes! The Labour controlled City Council ignored their manifesto - voting 9-4 in favour of the 4.8 mile road, costing £250 MILLION! This will make it the most expensive road in Europe. It will destroy 27 homes, churches and listed buildings as well as local communities on the south side of Glasgow.

Arrogant councillors are refusing to meet the locals or visit the site. Local support is growing rapidly. Residents are furious that £250 m is spent on a road whilst Glasgow's housing problem continues to be ignored.

Labour councillors main concerns are to promote tourism and big business as opposed to the interests of the local people. Locals warned "tourists don't visit war zones... the only overseas visitors this city will have will be environmental protesters and journalists." The council haven't learnt anything from Pollok. Campaigners are calling on people to join what is to be the "largest Scottish land agitation since the eighteenth century." Many buildings need squatting. A WIN IN WINDSOR

Twenty oaks will be saved after The Crown Estate reconsidered their plans to destroy the trees in Windsor Great Park. 48 other oaks and 105 young lime trees will be replanted. Protesters have been occupying the site for the past three months. This victory clearly highlights the effectiveness of direct action and that our actions can have an effect on the future. There is some unhappiness as the Estate fails to say exactly how many lime trees will be felled. M66

The Budget and financial costs are the issues currently being targeted by protesters against the M66 Greater Manchester ring road extension. The campaigners are targeting MP's - writing letters to press that part one of the scheme, rumoured to be dropped until the next financial year, will be scrapped. The extension is planned to cost £76m. Protesters are warning that it will cost much more - they will see to it that it does! Regular actions are planned kicking off with a big 'un on Nov. 3rd. A show of strength is needed ensuring that work is stopped in the run up to the Budget. There was a picket at Ashton Magistrates Court on Oct. 26th in support of arrested protesters. LE PETIT MERDE CHIRAC

France has detonated its third nuke in the Pacific, sparking more protests around the world. In Britain hundreds of protesters demonstrated at Chequers during a date between Major and Chirac. 12 arrests were made as some protesters broke through security to enter the gardens. As a result of the meeting, Major has pledged his support to French Nuke testing and is showing off that France and Britain have entered into Nuke cooperation and a new "entente cordial". 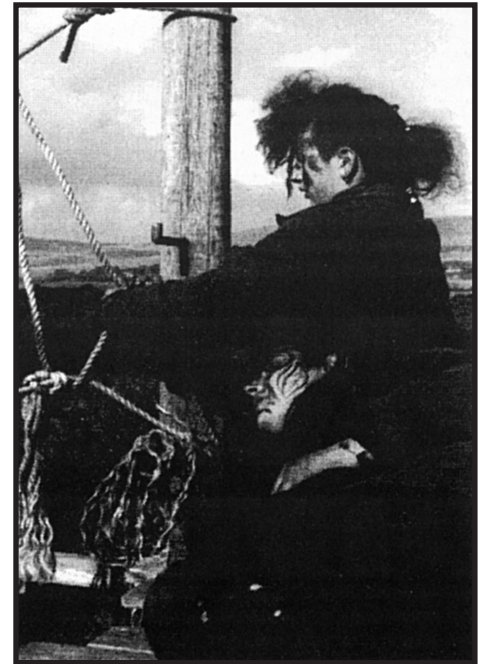
