EVICTIION FRENZY!

Selar, Daisy Nook, Snelsmore ...

February has seen a wave of evictions at anti-road and opencast camps. Camps at Selar Nature Reserve and Daisy Nook on the route of the M66 have been trashed, with attention now turning to the camps on the route of the Newbury Bypass.

On Wednesday 21st February the Daisy Nook camp at Oldham was evicted. Sixty activists occupied the trees, but were heavily outnumbered by security and police. It took a day for the camp to be cleared: 24 trees, 7 tree houses and a scaffolding tower. Sheriff's Officer Andrew Wilson, who has a reputation for unsafe practices, led the bailiffs and Richard Turner Ltd provided eviction climbers. Police held back another 30 people on the ground. There are plans to set up another 2 camps. 0161 6284727

The climbing team along with Andrew Wilson then moved on to Selar for a bitter eviction, starting on Monday 26th February. 50 activists were outnumbered by 150 security. Bailiffs came in early, cutting walkways with people on them and endangering life. Activists they could not reach were captured by a combination of climbers and cherry pickers. Eventually, after a particularly nasty struggle, the site was cleared on Wednesday. Locals will continue the struggle. At the time of going to press the heavily defended Snelsmore camp on the route of the Newbury By-pass had held out for two days. This marks a new chapter in the Third Battle of Newbury as the state attempts to evict more than 24 camps on the route. The tunnel system at Snelsmore was captured along with several tree houses but bailiffs did not return on Saturday 2nd, allowing the camp to be rebuilt. More people desperately needed to defend these camps - organise transport from your area - contact 01635 45544 to find which are the best times. Some funding may be available.

As well as police and bailiffs, two other factors have allowed these evictions to occur. Large numbers of security guards, hired by Reliance Security and a team of climbers, provided by Richard Turner Ltd. Plucked from the trees at Selar

Selar

"Nine months after we took the Selar Farm site in the Vale of Neath South Wales, the massed Forces of Darkness desolated 18 acres of mature oak woodland and water meadows. Reliance again supplied the bodies, Walters Plant Hire supplied the mother raping machinery and the Police presided over the injustice.

"The speed of Monday's assault surprised everyone. Selar Farm formed a small part of the 880 acre site and work's not due to start properly until July. It was an SSSI, but no legal means or political petition could prevent it's destruction. Instead the market demands cheap coal and gets it the cheapest way possible: using fuck off machinery to scrape off the trees and vegetation from the countryside and rip the coal out. It's going to be one of the largest holes in Europe - restoration plans include a golf course." - Ian

Daisy Nook

"One comrade was high in a tree which overhung the road at Lumb Lane. Because he had decided to go up at the last minute, he had no ropes or harnesses. The ground protesters were opposite the police lines in classic pose - working class against the capitalist army. The shitehead with chainsaw started to cut up towards his feet while the constabulary deliberately turned away. We surged forward into the police lines in an anger that we had been feeling all day but had found difficult to give vent to physically... the feeling of solidarity afterwards was great.

"It feels like Spring won't come to Daisy Nook this year. As for the climbers: Scum! Andy Coish, Ian Harrison, Paul Newton, we know where you are. If any readers fancy a quiet chat try the Broadfield pub, Sheffield." - A red squirrel.

Newbury

"I arrived in Newbury on a Tuesday, having just finished work. I had been to road camps before but had never climbed nor experienced an eviction. A week and a half later I found myself hanging 50 feet up with just a rope between myself and the ground while hundreds of glow-in-the-dark men walked around the trees.

"I was at Snelsmore Common which turned out to be the site of the first attempted eviction. We were woken at 4.30 in the morning and remained skybound for 48 hours as the bailiffs did their best to remove us. The whole experience has been immense. The sense of community is inspirational, crossing all boundaries of age and class. So many people coming together for such a worthwhile cause has lifted me to new heights. "I had seen Newbury on television and it was awakening; I arrived and it was eye-opening; I clung to a tree as men clad in black tried to pull me from my home and it was something only to be felt, never justified by explanation. When chaos reigns around you, it truly becomes clear - we are right, what we are doing is right, and it feels totally liberating." - Jess

Despite massive opposition, the proposed expansion of Whatley Quarry in Somerset is still set to go ahead. Work could start in 12 months time, but Mendip District Council have set aside £50,000 for a possible Judicial Review. Court cases against over 50 protesters still pending.

Holtsfield Reprieved!

Hawks Get Hammered

On January 29th, three women were arrested at the British Aerospace Military site in Warton, Lancashire. They disarmed a Hawk aeroplane with household hammers, causing £13 million worth of damage. The Ploughshares group aim to disarm Hawk aircraft destined for Indonesia - to be used for genocide against the people of East Timor. This was the 56th Ploughshares Action world wide and the third in Britain. Activists take full responsibility for their non - violent actions of disarmament allowing themselves to be arrested. Charged with illegal entry and criminal damage, the women are on remand for four weeks at Risley Prison, Warrington. The trial commences on March 7th at Lytham Magistrates Court. Contact 01582 36038. Time to Get Serious

It's true that actions speak louder than words, but people involved in action still need to communicate, between themselves and to those wishing to get involved. Although we have considerable public support there are still only tens of people on most actions. People want to get involved but they don't know how to, or don't feel able to. Why is this?

Most Earth First! type groups only consist of a few people who are generally friends and share the same culture. This is important and one of our main strengths. However, if we are to win campaigns and bring about lasting change, we need to be able to involve more people in each group.

There are two main factors stopping our growth. We are very bad at communicating and we are also often down right rude. People new to the movement often have a vision of us as gentle eco-warriors, fighting against the dark forces of capitalism, and greed. In reality we're just as fucked up as the rest of society, suffering from many of the same social ills. Placed in high stress environments, seeing the destruction of land to which we have become bonded, it's no wonder we don't have a lot of time to consider others. One of the main complaints we receive at the

Faslane Peace Camp

Faslane Peace Camp, 30 miles from Glasgow has been actively protesting against nuclear weapons for the last 13 years. From April they'll be under threat of eviction by a new Council who have made it clear they want to close the camp. People living on the site are asking for help from ex-residents who have energy to protect this symbol of peace. Actions are planned to remember Chernobyl from April 22nd - 26th. To get new people involved we need to diversify, listen to each other and organise. Support and legal backup for people who are risking their liberty is still lacking in many cases. At the very least we should be able to raise funds, offering to pay peoples fines. If we don't organise as a movement it doesn't matter how much public support we've got. We'll still get crushed and go the way of so many other groups in the past that have taken on the state. Either we get ourselves together or sit back and wait for the industrialised, capitalist world to drown in it's own shit, probably taking us with it.

Feelings such as passion, creativity and anger are a gift. They are our greatest asset. Don't let them turn to frustration and bickering.

This issue is dedicated to the women who smashed up a £13 million Hawk Jet Fighter at a British Aerospace factory, with household hammers. Respect.

Kings X Women's Centre

Volunteers at Kings Cross Womens Centre have provided free advice & support to thousands of women (and men) since 1975. MP Ken Livingstone gave women the premises in 1979 at a rent of £2 per week. In December 1993 without consulting the centre, Camden Council sold it to the 'Community Housing Association' (CHA) for £14,000. Less than a year later CHA demanded £6,000 rent per year. The centre was unable to pay, so CHA responded with eviction proceedings. CHA are part of a consortium to develop Kings Cross for The Channel Tunnel Link and aim to 'clean up' the area for business. 10 Years Since Chernobyl

Ashton Court Action

On February 19th, 50 people gathered for an action at Durnford Quarry, Ashton Court, Bristol. Pioneer Aggregates, the owners of the Quarry feared a re-run of December's Whatley Quarry festivities. £10's of thousands were spent on new security fencing around the site. A hundred cops and private security were present preventing mass invasion. There were two arrests, but no charges. Little work could be done. A decision on the expansion of the quarry will be made soon.



Reclaim the Streets of Brighton

Reclaim the Streets

Brighton, Feb 14th; for almost 4 hrs, North St was reclaimed from the car. In true valentine's style, pollution and aggression were replaced by community and lurve. Sussex pigs were left flat footed as hundreds occupied the road. Then the party started. People played, drummed, danced and boinged on a bouncy castle. As people were dispersing, the forces of the state moved in to reestablish their law and order. Despite loads of violence, the pigs found it hard to 'clear' the street in the face of people's resistance. 43 arrests were made to reassert car and capital's dominance. All but 10 charges were dropped. By going in so heavy 'liberal Sussex police' showed intolerance of people acting outside their control and threw down a gauntlet for the future. See ya soon boys in blue.

Legalise Hemp

CHIC (Cannabis Hemp Information Club) is pushing for the legalisation of cannabis. Through information and education they're exposing the hypocrisy of the prohibition. Cascadia Rising!

Actions to stop the logging of old growth forest in the Cascade Mountains, north west USA continue. An injunction preventing the logging has been lifted. The Forestry Service placed a locked gate across the access road to prevent environmentalists from entering the area. Activists used the gate as a fullscale barricade with reinforced lock-on points as well as stockades, concrete drums and trenches. The Cascadia Free State was born! Holding the blockade for a record 5 months, and still growing. 100's have been arrested during tree-sits, lock-ons and rallies. Cascadia Forest Defenders, PO Box 11122, Eugene, OR 97440. USA

Window Bricking Good!

102 farmers were arrested after the trashing of a Kentucky Fried Chicken store on January 30th, in Bangalore, India. The store was trashed to protest against the opening of the fast food chain. The farmers are concerned that multinational corporations will deplete the country's livestock - affecting agriculture, the environment, and health. Professor Nanjundaswamy of the Kamataka State Farmers Association has been released but 101 farmers are still in police custody. They also oppose other multinationals like Curgell Seeds, Pepsi, and McDonalds.

Shell in Nigeria

19 people are currently facing the same charges as Ken Saro Wiwa. If found guilty they also face execution. Ten of these people are seriously ill and have been refused hospital treatment. Anti Shell actions continue. In Oxford, Shell's Management training session was sabbed and the building occupied. Shell's AGM is on May 15th. Info: 01865 791391

Squat the Asylum Bill

On February 5th, all benefits were cut off to large numbers of asylum seekers and refugees. The Old Courthouse in Hackney was squatted as an Autonomous Refugee Centre, to house those made homeless by these new regulations. Since then it's been evicted but they expect to have a new building soon. Its hoped that similar projects can be sorted elsewhere. Links with refugee & community groups need to be strengthened. Other forms of practical support needed include: the defence of refugee's homes threatened with attack; legal and illegal support; advice and organising to cover for services denied to asylum seekers.
