NOT ANOTHER RTS...

The police wanted Not Another RTS in Sheffield, but then so did the 'organisers', intending it to be in the spirit of the old 70s Jubilee street parties, minus the Queen. A dual carriageway location was negotiated, and a few hundred partygoers, 'protected' by about three times that number of cops taking many holiday snaps and videos of the colourful throng, and a helicopter, proceeded to play football & human draughts to the rhythms of Orpheus (Sheffield's very own 'Rinky Dink' pedal-powered sound system), before being escorted to a pedestrianised area.

Bristol - "We're up for it today; we know you're just a bunch of professional anarchists", sez Chief Inspector

Copper. And so they were, with mounted police, helicopter, and many baton-beatings, plus the use of CS gas. The sound system didn't get through, an 8 foot long hedgehog was squashed, but the police's reaction only made people more determined, and by the end of the day, there were up to 500 RTSers. The planned roundabout location was blocked by police all day, so party-goers spilled onto surrounding roads, including the M32, to be met by mounted police. 59 arrests, 8 charged. Nearby IKEA, currently the target of a local campaign, closed for the weekend and hired security.

Despite experiencing only two days of sunshine in 13 weeks of rain, the damp but jolly souls at Faslane peace camp continue to cause merry hell with the laughable base 'security'. 8 campers broke in and played football. After seeing the formidable camp defences on telly, the cash-strapped local council agreed to talks with residents to try to find an amicable (& cheaper!) solution. Activists from Ploughshares Trident 2000 set up a second camp at Coulport to begin two weeks of accountable nuke-base disarmament. Actions have been numerous and varied - blockades. fence-cuttings, 'citizen's inspections', repainting MoD property (khaki is so dull), an early music gate blockade, and swimming to within yards of the evil subs themselves 3 times over - with

> 22 September (see Prisoners). Faslane folk showed their gratitude to the crew of the NV Greenpeace by delaying for 2 hours - they locked-on - a trawler which had been hired by oil companies to trail the ship. With ongoing actions, 97 people pledged to NVDA so far, and another action camp at Faslane in November, there's plenty more to come.

THE REVOLUTION IS BEING TELEVISED....

ALF activists heard that police wanted to search a property. As they made sure there was always someone at home, one day a Housing Benefit officer arrived, with plain clothes copper in tow, who was introduced as her boss. As he had no ID, and gave the name 'Mr Smith', he was not allowed entry. The HB officer didn't stay long, as Mr Smith was busy taking down a vehicle number plate outside. The benefit office was instructed to confirm Mr Smith worked there, but was 'unavailable' when phoned. By chance, the plucky house-dwellers found out they were under further surveillance, when their neighbours told them that they could faintly make out their house on their TVs, in place of soonto-be-received Channel 5. From the image, it was worked out roughly where the camera was, but this was inside a house. However, in a nearby local water authority outhouse a 12 metrehigh tripod with microwave receiver pointed at the camera a mile away was found. The gizmo was connected to a TV monitor and slow record video machine. Over the next few weeks, each day, a plainclothed copper turned up to change the cassette. One day, all the equipment was liberated, and is now in a safe and loving home. This kind of surveillance is used before a more intensive (& expensive) operation can be sanctioned.

Meanwhile, at Hillgrove, 20 agents provocateurs with fake ear and nose rings shouted abuse at their copper-colleagues before changing openly (accountably?) into their police overalls...

A "longsuffering" Undercurrents journalist, who made the feature on coppers' harassment of journalists, was arrested again whilst filming police violence at Bristol RTS. A Bristol-based documentary maker was arrested while reporting on an anti-GE protest in Totnes, his house raided with video tapes, computer hard drive, and various written materials seized. Someone who recently videotaped inside Cornyhaugh mink farm, Northumberland, to highlight the conditions, was injuncted under the Protection from Harassment Act 1997 (to protect women from being stalked), then arrested and given a nightime house curfew.

NOT A LOTT MENTS

Allotments are the next target for development in many towns that are paying lip service to not developing greenfield sites. Local councils have recently been given power to dispose of them, though central government managed to ditch over 53 in the last year. Railtrack issued eviction orders for all their allotment sites, but withdrew after protest. At the end of the enclosure movement, around the 1850s, the sop of allotments on crappy land was given to shut up the 'working man'. Resist enclosure! Contact TLIO.

HOTTING UP

A planned supermarket development on the largest empty space in South Sheffield, where 3 already exist within a mile, is being opposed. The Tysak site was occupied for a weekend to show alternative uses of the site, with cricket and football pitches and a cinema put up, and though it rained and rained all weekend, local kids came to play, as did those employed by the council. Contact via Sheffield EF!

Sharston Green is a 28 acre green site on the Manchester/Stockport border, owned by Manchester Airport, AMEC etc. Planning permission has been granted (surprise!) to build houses, industrial estate (flight simulator planned) and a grotty hotel/pub fast-poison outlet. The campaign to save this space includes ongoing Village Green applications, and calling in the Ombudsman about collusion. Construction work commenced just recently, and many mature oak trees were felled. The pond is being drained and the area attacked by bulldozers. We're getting well sharsted - desperate situation - call 0161-998 1888/491 5560

Bridgewater, Somerset: Local opposition building against 1000 new houses that will trash greenbelt land - need help opposing planning application, and direct action advice - 01278 424146

Xanadu, Europe's largest indoor leisure complex, planned on 70 acres of wildlife corridor, with a 3,500 car park. It requires a new busway (on old railway line which is a wildlife corridor), then connects to ordinary roads into Manchester. The campaign's just started, with a rally of 35 horses & 100 people, and 4 public meetings so far. Contact via the Campaign Legal Group.

The M4 relief road - £320 million worth of six lane motorway through 5 Sites of Special Scientific Interest within the internationally important Gwent Levels - is still in the Welsh roads programme, pending an announcement later in the year, making it the most expensive and destructive road planned for anywhere in the UK - CALM <amanda@martin7.demon.co.uk>

EARTH FIRST! "SUMMER" GATHERING

The time has come for the eco-direct action gathering of the year - it runs from Wednesday 9th to Monday 14th September and will be held in Somerset. There are lift shares from around the country, so get on down. There will be a reception, reading library, kids' space, workshop spaces, and organic vegan food at £2 a day. We will be camping (a women-only space will be provided), so bring a tent. Limited space for parking and live-in vehicles available near to the site.

The exact location is kept secret until the day before it starts. Entrance is £10 a person, and everybody will pay this - even workshops-givers and organisers, so everything stays as cheap as possible for everyone.

Strictly no dogs will be allowed on site for a variety of reasons, and there is a proposal to have no drinking of alcohol on site before dinner. Guidelines will be decided in the first site meeting.

This year, the programme will be split between workshops and large discussions covering topics such as tactics, strategy and long-term sustainability. There will also be UK and International Campaigns' Forums to give people an opportunity to tell others about their group, campaign or forthcoming actions. GENE ARRESTS

11 people were arrested as they attempted to uproot GE sugar beet just

south of Lincoln, as part of a genetiX snowball action. 8 new members of the local group were arrested by the waiting police, as they reached the release site. The remaining three were successful in uprooting 10 beet before also being arrested for criminal damage, attempted criminal damage and going equipped to cause criminal damage with gardening tools; no charges have yet been pressed. The police and farmer were notified in advance of the time and place. A letter to the Environment Agency asked them to safely dispose of the GE material. The Monsanto injunction against the first 5 snowballers lists all their release sites. 13 people were arrested after the decontamination of a genetics release site in Totnes, Devon, two charged with criminal damage of £605,000, curfews and daily reporting to a cop-shop imposed. The others are awaiting the results of forensic tests. The site was the subject of a high-profile court case, in which a farmer was fighting to retain his organic status, threatened by nearby GE cross-pollination. Over thirty people, many local, uprooted maize before it flowered. The site had 24 hour security guard surveillance following an abortive attempt. Properties in Somerset, Devon, Bristol, Sheffield and London were raided by police after the arrests. Locals held a public meeting, and

community response to the corporate assault on our land". Despite Mutanto slapping injunctions and recent arrests, actions continue to grow. 5 people openly pulled GE oilseed rape near Dundee. They were arrested and charged with aggravated trespass and malicious mischief, but charges were dropped after 50 hours, just before they were due in court. There have been conflicting reports as to whether the crop was GE.

One Sunday a group of about ten local residents decided to go to church. But instead of attending a religious service they decided it might be more useful to dig up some Monsanto sugar beet at Church Farm, in Norfolk. It took place in broad daylight, though it's still unclear if anybody other than them saw God!

Potatoes with the inserted genes of chickens, jellyfish, sunflowers, viruses and bacteria to name but a few, were all too much for one group who decontaminated 20 of Leeds Uni's GE plots.

Their lookouts spotted hare shooters in a pick-up truck with a powerful spotlight, but they weren't going to be caught in the headlights, no siree.

NEWS IN BRIEF

The remains of the **once-huge roads programme** was slashed even further in the Roads Review. Only 37 schemes - including M25 widening and Bingley - are planned for the next 7 years, with over 100 scrapped, deferred, or given to local authorities to worry about.

Up to 4,000 people danced at Finland's 4th RTS, with trees planted & a pro-Zapatista demo as part of the day.

Rumours are the Newbury Bypass may open on 8 Nov.

150 European activists at the **Kola anti-nuclear camp**, a 24-hour police watch, a banner hanging on the power plant's admin building roof, and a blockade of the entrance. The anti-terrorist nuke plant guard have announced their plans to do violent raids on the camp....and local government are starting to talk about developing wind power sources for the area.

The 2 remaining GAndALF defendants are still awaiting a date for trial, though the convictions of the 3 who spent 5 months inside were quashed on appeal.

Another global day of action has been proposed for Friday 18.6.99 - a day of carnival, chaos, protest and action in financial centres, coinciding with the G8 meeting in Köln, Germany. The goal is to strengthen our international networks from the Global RTS, and show that the global system, based on exploitation of people and planet, for profit for the few, is at the root of our troubles. Mutant veg recently invaded Taunton Safeways, shouting "Resist us if you can!" Shopping trolleys were labelled with "Contaminated" stickers, but the mutant veg escaped before police arrived, with the chilling message - "We'll be BACK." Defence plans are being formed.

The OKasional squat cafe II opened recently by a canal in Manchester's red light district; a possession order was granted after about 3 weeks, though the judge termed the occupation "honourable and ecologically sensitive". It's reopened at an old pub at 111, Newton Street. Eviction unlikely. Contact via MEF!

Following Ecotopia in Freiburg, Germany, Europoean festival goers held a RTS with bandanged car victims, Death, and tripods, & built on their new 'carwalking' skills.

One of last month's South Downs the Land is Ours Mass Trespasses ended at Glyndebourne Opera House, where 50 crashed a lunch do. "The Dispossessed have returned."

The GMO roadshow is a touring anti-GE event, to link up with any public meeting you organise in your area. Contact via the Earth Circus Network.

Around 120 people went to the hot WCA Gathering in Radstock. Afterwards activists surrounded the Tor Works Quarry offices (due for expansion), then disrupted road construction at Dead Woman's Bottom.

A court decided a shopper who put a 'Contaminated' sticker on a packet of GE contaminated 'Beanfeast' was (eventually) found not guilty of intending to cause public alarm.

Tarmac want to extend a quarry in Sherwood Forest. A picnic and a Beat the Bulldozer pledge have happened.

In the last month there have been seven decontaminations (including one only partly). Actions have varied in style, with stealthy nocturnal raids, daylight decontaminations, and accountable snowball actions; the important thing is that the job is getting done. The biotech multinationals are finding that their scheme to turn our land into a giant laboratory will not be easy. Although 35 exsites is impressive, there's still over 300 British test sites - loads left to do. Contact GEN on how to get involved, or for help on finding your local GE sites.

BREWERY FIELDS FOREVER

"How different the movement of a tree breathing the night air that rocks you to sleep, to vibrations of the leaves as the digger hits the roots. There is now a 30 foot channel carved through the woodland and meadows, and 17 nicked activists.

Brewery Fields, a beautiful piece of common land in Bangor, unploughed for 40 years, a marvellous view of the sea prized by local residents and potential developers alike. When the bulldozers threatened to move in, and after 5 years of fighting planning permission, we set up camp on the site of the development, but were tortured out of our lockons (we're taking them to court). We then moved in to stop the access road. 25 acres would be set aside as a nature park, but they still intended further housing developments on the remaining 16. A deal was offered to avoid this last eviction -"come down and we'll cause minimal damage". While negotiations were going on, more used walkways to get up trees, before the deal was refused. Rope bridges were cut with unharnessed protesters on them; others were violently wrestled out of the trees. They tried to hack away at a tunnel with a shovel, only damaging the door, so blocking the occupant's only exit. We held out for 22 hours. So we've won 25 acres but there may be more to do; outline planning permission originally granted 40 years ago has recently been renewed, and the planning committee is a quango stuffed with potential developers. They may think again about developing now they know the local 'silly haircut, sit in a tree and shout' brigade is still around. "

CAMP IT UP

The Bingley Bypass Camp almost tatted down recently. The same people have been sustaining it for 2 years, and the road was recently seen the official go-ahead. However, a few remain there for the next month, by which time it will be known when it's likely to be built, and so when an eviction can be expected. £20 million's already been spent on pre-works. Eviction possibly early next year. Good local support & skip, and a ground hut on stilts. The decision whether to de-camp will be taken on how many people can stay there long term, so get down there soon - ring mobile or Leeds EF!

Cheltenham's first protest camp, Toytown, has solid local support and a fantastic vibe on site, with momentum building - due partly to a 'no drink, no drugs' policy. "Just like Wyndham Hill in Yeovil a couple of years ago, the political will isn't really there. If we can get rid of the profit motive, then Waitrose and their cronies will see sense and run." Local people are angry because their children will lose the only playing field in the area. It's also one of the last green spaces in the area, a riverside wildlife habitat, including bats, two potential brownfield housing sites, and the historic Alstone Spa. Instead, the council has given permission for two new roads, 1,500 car parking spaces, a supermarket, a drive through fast food restaurant, a 10 screen cinema shed, a petrol station, a nightclub, a bowling alley, a theme pub and a private health and fitness centre, all of which Cheltenham already has. After 2 years, the campaign to protect the area has moved into direct action, setting up camp and organising high-profile stunts to embarrass the council and the 'developers'. The camp has a compost toilet, covered kitchen, office and benders. Come and build more treehouses, help with activities for the young people who use the woodland as a play area, and build a permaculture garden. We need climbing equipment, polyprop, tarps, building wood, vegan food, TOYS! and money. Visit!

Silver Birches Eco-Village in Epsom went to the High Court to be evicted, but the judge gave the 11 year old defendant a stay of execution until the 1 October. Under UN & international child protection legislation, kids have the right to be heard, consulted and to participate in environmental decisions affecting their future. A local councillor didn't like being told where to stick his Agenda 21, so he's been threatening campers with violence as he pours on the abuse - "We can't afford to evict you. Fuck off while you've still got time". Petrol has been poured on a tent and set fire to, stones thrown, and the campaign desk was also smashed under cover of night; the council is believed to know something about these events. The camp's been there for 4 or 5 months, occupying prime (stockbroker belt) development land, woods, & a house.

Green Guard in Nantwich, has been stopping a housing development of 500 houses and a 4 mile dual carriageway for the last 6 weeks. Under threat are (rare) Black Poplars, an orchard and hedgerows up to 30 foot thick. The allotments next door have all been given notices to quit too. The camp boasts treehouses, tunnel, tower, and 97% local support. Local media are on side.

In Hulme, the popular Poplar 24-hour guard wasn't quite, and so Manchester council started chopping the 110 year old Birley Tree down before people stopped the chainsaws. The campaign went to court to be evicted, and negotiated an agreement not to fell the Black Poplar till a detailed planning application was put in for the hotel the council so desperately want for this inner-city area. This has followed meetings, petitions, Fun-days, a carnival float, and a procession to the Town Hall where severed branches blocked the entrance whilst demonstrators danced.

At Ashton Court, preparation work is being done for the 'translocation' (trashing) of the wildflower meadow (surrounded by 7 foot high spiky fence), which is meant to start at the beginning of this month. It'll take four months, but if delayed till January, they'll then be too late to start it till autumn '99. A second camp has been set up, the new 'New State of Bulgaria', where secret tunnel building has been happening over recent months. As we go to press, preparations for the weekend of action, party and workshops go on apace.

In Bushey Park, a protest camp to stop a housing development has been set up, including developing Grade 2 listed buildings, and an old MoD torpedo shell testing dome. Campaigners instead want an education and environmental centre, & with 3,000 supporters and much in donations, it looks good. The camp was moved off the development site in order to show goodwill for negotiations, with the original site now fenced off.

Arthur's Wood camp is still intact but underpopulated, with the court date looming. The National Trust are removing environmentalists (accused of "trampling on the ground") from their land in order to allow Manchester Airport to trash it. The issues at stake are: to highlight the National Trust selling off 'inviolable' land here and around the country (& getting a pay-off!); to focus attention again on Runway 2 & further delay it and to challenge the AMEC/Tarmac joint venture that's illegally destroying trees and hedgerows.

Victory for the Derby Bass Rec protestors who have started coming down from the treetops following a council decision to change the road plans, saving the Recreation Ground and instead shaving away the verge. Fun days and a Planning for Real exercise were held.

St Mary's Churchyard campers in Southampton have disbanded the camp as the Church have scaled down their plans and gone back to the drawing board. It'll be 6 months before they put in the planning application, and they'll talk with campaigners at the end of this month. The camp had also been attacked one night by organised thugs not from the local area, who trashed tents, badly bruised someone's back and broke someone else's finger. Locals are completely supportive, and the camp will set up again if needed.

LMS Railway Station passengers in Oxford dropped a road down the front of the Sheldonian Theatre recently, a much better idea than trashing the trees in front of the station, to build a six-lane road junction next to the University's shiny new arms-funded Business School. In answer to the possession order recently granted, defendants have pulled their own strings - walkways, abseil lines and phone-trees. The camp is now a happy buzzing place preparing for an inventive, creative, full-on fun-packed anarchic pisstake of an eviction... all we need is a drove more people! Come and join the world's first city-centre heritage protest camp - we have a No Drugs + No Alcohol rule, snug treehouses, cargo-nets, barricades, lockons, bunkers, and the world's first Sofa-Lock-On!

Crystal Palace recently had their possession order, and so are preparing to defend the site. A womble defendant appeared in court, and the eviction is being appealed. To join the eviction phone tree, ring 0181 659 3301.



'ACTION UPDATE: ONWARDS, UPWARDS, AND HEADING ACROSS THE PENNINES' - A VIEW FROM THE OUTGOING AU CREW

"A few years ago, when I hitched to my first EF! Gathering with a friend, we were picked up by someone with a job at Greenpeace who'd decided to go along to Snowdonia to see what we Earth First!ers were all about. Having stumbled across some (us) before even getting there, he decided to begin his quizzing on the way... Why, he asked, does Earth First! do this? And that? And not that? And shouldn't you have a policy on such-and-such, and be making a statement about so-and-so? We thought about that for a bit, probably for the first time. It seemed impossible to answer any of these questions without addressing some of his underlying analysis - for a start, apart from structural/philosophical assumptions, the idea that anyone within the EF! network might actually agree with anyone else about anything! But it suddenly seemed quite difficult to explain to someone with a job in a green organisation that had members, money, and official policies on just about everything. Eventually my friend decided to give it a go. "Well, you see," he said, hoping to make it all clear, "Earth First! doesn't actually exist."

I think the Greenpeace guy spent the Gathering still being confused, though I'm sure he had a good time. But I remembered that not very illuminating statement, because if you can add enough to it, it does kind of explain something unique about EF! as it exists currently: you can't join it, you just get on with it. But it has its manifestations - the Gathering, Do or Die, numerous actions - and the Action Update.

Now I could go on about EF! (supposedly) being a community or network or whatever-the-hell-it-is with unique room for diversity, change (I hope), political debate, etc, but I won't. The point is the importance of the Update, not just for the EF! network but potentially for the larger ecological/direct action/revolutionary movement. Yeah, alternative press is important anyway but the Update is a way to define and voice what it is we're doing, in a community that has, and should have, lots to say but little of the party-line definition of mainstream green groups. We, and other people not so involved, should be able to trace the continuities and changes within the movement though reading the Action Update. We can see the challenges we face up to and try to tackle. And through our actions, and reporting them, we speak of our visions, to the wider world and ourselves. We learn about what we're all up to round the country, and build a feeling of solidarity and community - togetherness. I once heard someone from a Southern peasants' movement that spanned many countries say: "What unifies us is diversity." I'd never thought of that before, but it does, so long as we try to make a bit of time for each other and our different ways of being and acting. In all of this, too, we have to remember that however loose and disparate we are, there is this vague network linking us. Together we are more possible than they could powerfully imagine. And if we put something into this network, rather than just expecting it to continue, we are more powerful too. This brings me back to the Action Update.

The EF!AU has been going for 7 years now. It's meant to change editorial group each year, thus sharing responsibility and avoiding institutionalising power and skills in one place. This helps avoid centralisation, and of course puts a huge strain on the poor activists who take it on. I'll be glad to pass it on. I'll be able to complain about the Manchester rain, do sundances, and get rained on, stop sitting in front of this screen in a cold basement, and get stuck back into campaigning.

In a recent Schnews, the folk who usually put it together announced their intention of going to the beach, and on their return expecting to see all the people who valued Schnews in the office busy producing it. Now Manchester, which the Update is leaving, and Leeds, where it is going, both have no beach, but imagine the spiritual equivalent. The Update has got to be a collective responsibility. It can be one of the best (only?) tools we have for outreach, if we make it so, on a national and a local basis. It can be a way of affirming what we're getting done, it can be a challenge to the meaningless drivel most people get fed by the media, a way into a different vision - if we both sort it out, and get it out there."

How? Okay, list follows:

WRITE your actions up. Don't just send the press releases or leaflets, send the stories in Update size and shape, as soon afterwards as you can, and certainly by the deadline (usually end of the month, but check). Do this every time you do anything. DISTRIBUTE copies. Take them everywhere you go - festivals, actions, meetings, university, work, weddings, funerals - you are challenging the 'reality' created by the press. FLYPOST it everywhere, so people who don't have any contact with the movement can get informed and involved. FUNDRAISE. We have a constant uphill struggle to ensure money from subscriptions cover costs, and right now, we're losing badly. The more money there is, the more free copies get out to everywhere. There's nothing else for cash to go on but printing and postage so you know it's doing something useful. Write INSERTS. They're generally to provide information for action, whether they're about an issue, or are a 'how to'. Send 'em in, they'll probably be used. Send action PHOTOS, CARTOONS, DRAWINGS - so will they, if they come out OK. PROMOTE the Update. Get your local bookshop to sell it, sell it on the street yourself, put it in other groups' mailouts, subscribe your local library, etc.

If you like it how it is, be part of creating it, if you don't, be part of changing it. Get on with it. The new contact details are:
