CAR FREE DAY

European Car Free Day was officially celebrated in some British cities, but in those where it wasn't activists celebrated it anyway.

In Newcastle for example, early-rising cyclists visited the home of Cabinet Minister Kevin Jones with a trishaw, in the vain hope of persuading him to go to work on it. Very official-looking flyers appeared on the windscreens of hundreds of parked cars in the city centre, informing motorists of road closures on Car Free Day, as well as all-day free travel on Newcastle's Metro system. Notices also appeared at the underground Metro stations. Metro broadcasted all day for two days contradicting the notices, laid on extra ticket inspectors and didn't fine any fare-dodgers for the day.

Meanwhile a banner appeared over the city's central motorway telling motorists 'Kill Car Culture Before It Kills You'. 'Immobilization' leaflets were posted on hundreds of parked vehicles, giving official notification of the dangers of too much reliance on motor transport.

Late in the afternoon 200 or so people gathered for Newcastle's second Reclaim the Streets. A tripod blocked the entrance to the Civic Centre car park, although a sound system was seized early, and damaged, by police. Two people were arrested, but both released quickly.

Manchester's Reclaim the Streets Six have all walked free. The 6 were charged with trumped-up public order offences following last year's RTS action in Manchester. Their case was heard in June. The CCTV evidence showed a large number of violent and disorderly police officers baton-charging their way into a peaceful crowd without warning. Witnesses flatly contradicted the police lies.

DUMP THE PUMP FOR GOOD

The "Dump the Pump for Good" cycling event was organised to counter the car-lobby's event on August 1st. Hundreds of cyclists moved through the city, inviting commuters to join in and discover the healthy vitality and community spirit enjoyed by London's cyclists. Riders had whistles, hooters etc..

RISING TIDE

On 11th September the protest group 'Rising Tide' constructed an oil pipe in the garden of Shell spokesperson Tim van Kooten near The Hague, The Netherlands, protesting climate change. 'Accidentally', they also caused an oilspill. The activists said he should "greenwash his own garden."

"This is the start of a season of action against corporations and institutions that promote climate change," says a Rising Tide spokesperson. "Actions will peak at the UN climate conference in November in The Hague, The Netherlands."

Rising Tide is a coalition of radical activists from several European countries and networks like Earth First! They demand a reduction of greenhouse gasses by 60% : necessary to halt climate change. The convention will discuss a reduction of 5.2%.

Rising Tide encourages every individual and organisation to go to their local community and discuss what creative, concrete action for climate justice well-being they can take. Our Governments are unable to take the tough decisions; the corporate lobbyists are freely imposing monstrous provisions into the climate treaty in their misinterpretation of the

News In Brief

- The 4 co-ordinators of the Stop Huntingdon Animal Cruelty campaign were remanded on trumped-up charges of incitement in mid August. They have since been released with strict bail conditions.
- Nick Pyne, veteran of the 3rd Battle of Newbury and other road campaigns, has died. He will be greatly missed.
- Respect is due to the three teenagers this summer who regularly dressed up like traffic police, complete with a hairdryer / speed-gun, and bluffed speeding drivers into slowing down through their car-blighted village.
- The vehicles of 5 Huntingdon Life Sciences workers were destroyed on August Bank Holiday.
- British Animal Lib prisoner Barb Trenholm has been released from prison having served a ten year sentence.
- Oscar Horta is an eco-activist who refused to be conscripted into the Spanish army because of his commitment to animal/earth liberation. Although he faced fines or a possible prison sentence, in court he only received a disqualification for standing for public office. (shucks!)
- Jose Marlucio da Silva, a Landless Rural Workers Movement (MST) activist, was shot and killed on the 25th July during an anti-biotech action in Recife, the capital of the north eastern Pernambuco state in Brazil. After occupying an Argentine boat carrying GM crops, the MST attempted to storm & occupy a bank. Jose was shot by police during the action.
- Jose Bove, the French organic sheep farmer turned environmental activist, has been sentenced to 3 months in prison for leading an action on a McDonald's construction site in August 1999.
- GM-giant Novartis has announced it will guarantee all its foods free of GM ingredients due to consumer pressure. Asked if Novartis' anti-GM stance conflicted with its position as a vociferous promoter of GM seeds, the spokesman said: "That's a totally different question."
- On July 15th, Manchester's gay rights and equality groups marched 'Out on the Streets' in protest at the failure of the government to repeal Section 28 of the Local Government Act 1988. This law encourages discrimination against lesbians and gay men and discourages accurate information on sexual issues. www.stonewall.org.uk
- Everyone beware of 'green-nazi' actions coming to the UK, maybe based around "Alt Green", a fascist ecology journal by nazi sympathiser Richard Hunt.
- A Man climbed part way up the London Eye millennium wheel as part of a weekend of protest against sanctions on Iraq. He was there between 7 am and 8.30 am, came down voluntarily and was released without charge. Contact : (0)20 78725451

So Now We Are Terrorists

The Terrorism Act received Royal Assent on 20 July 2000 and will come into force in the UK mainland in Spring 2001. While things look grim, there have been a number of amendments. However, the real fight against the labelling of wide sections of dissidents and activists as 'terrorists' - has only just begun.

Hardly a day goes past now without someone, be it farmers or biotech corporations complaining about their fields being decontaminated of GMOs, or politicians complaining about their conferences being blockaded, calling their opponents 'terrorists'. Sometimes the words 'terrorist' and 'activist' are used interchangeably. This, the ultimate in political exclusion, must be challenged or our society will become even more undemocratic. In truth, as we all know, the Act has little to do with preventing terrorism. The new definition of 'terrorism' is expressly designed to apply to people who do not carry guns or advocate the use of violence against others. The purpose of this Act is to halt the convergence of struggles that are taking place worldwide.

"Section 12 (2) *A person commits an offence if he arranges*, manages or assists in arranging or managing *a meeting** which he knows is - (a) to support a proscribed organisation, (b) to further the activities of a proscribed organisation, or (c) to be addressed by a person who belongs or professes to belong to a proscribed organisation. (3) A person commits an offence *if he addresses a meeting** and - (a) the purpose of his address is to encourage support for a proscribed organisation or to further its activities, or (b) he knows that the meeting is to be addressed by a person who belongs or professes to belong to a proscribed organisation. (4) In subsections (2) and (3) *"meeting" means** a meeting of *three or more persons**, whether or not the public are admitted. (5) *A person guilty** of an offence under this section *shall be liable** - (a) on conviction on indictment, *to imprisonment for** a term not exceeding *ten years**, to a fine or to both."

Terrorism Act, 2000ad.

This is the last Action Update being done by the present crew and no one has come forward to take it on. We will remain the contact point until a new crew takes over.

RIP Electronic Freedom

Following closely on the Terrorism Act comes the RIP Act (Regulation of Investigatory Powers). Also given royal assent, it will become law in October.

Firstly, UK based Internet Service Providers (ISP's)* will be legally obliged to give police, customs and security services open access to monitor all web traffic running through their networks.

Secondly, the Act will see the targeting of computer encryption users** with prison sentences of 2 years (if you refuse to hand over your encryption keys to the police), and 5 years (if you tell anyone you are being monitored).

And finally, the Act includes extra powers to plant Big Brother bugs and parabolic microphones wherever the sun might not shine - in the name of 'national security' and combating 'organised crime'. For example, the new generation of mobile phones will be implanted with a location device so that they know from where you're calling.

Many Internet Service Providers are now looking at uprooting their business and moving overseas.

RIP IT UP!

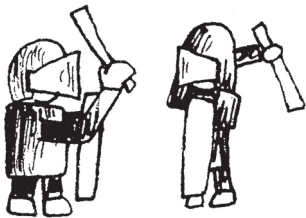
On the brighter side here are a few pointers on a few ideas on ways to rip up the RIP for solid on-line privacy and security.

(a) Be careful when choosing your ISP and e-mail account. The big corporate sites like Microsoft (Hotmail), Freeserve (Fsnets) and Yahoo UK (Yahoo Mail) that are already in the process of opening their networks for police 'real time' surfing tracking should be avoided.

(b) Look at ISP's that base their operations overseas, or smaller UK web server companies that are more likely to slip through the government fish net. Make sure they are not part of the multinational Internet oligarchy.

(c) Do use encryption and anonymous web surfing software like Freedom (www.zeroknowledge.com) or Pretty Good Privacy (www.pgp.com). Use free encrypted e-mail accounts like Hushmail, Messenger and Mail2Web (www.hushmail.com, www.messengerx.com and www.mail2web.com)

(d) Rather than storing data on your hard drive (which under the RIP can be accessed under warrant by MI5 or police) stash your private bits and pieces on the Net. There are companies like Freedrive (www.freedrive.com) where you can store info on their sites for download at a later date. Leicester's Radical Summer

Leicester folk have had an entertaining and enlightening summer this year. Kicking off proceedings was the gay Mardi Gras on July 29th. Originally cancelled because of rightwing threats, but then revived by Unity Against Prejudice, a coalition determined not to let the fascists set the rules, the event ended up a great success. 400 people turned up to samba through the streets in defiance of bigotry and hatred. Neither the 60 NFers who paraded through the city centre, nor the Anti-Nazi League who, piqued at their inability to control the agenda tried to organise an alternative demo, managed to spoil the day's fun. And people are already talking about next year's party.

Following this, on August 19th we reclaimed a patch of derelict land in the city centre and turned it into a colourful garden, complete with swing. The guerrilla gardeners also gave out locally-produced organic wine and plums harvested from a deserted garden. Everyone - gardeners, the public, and even a couple of passing policemen - had a great time, and we had excellent media coverage - the local paper, radio and TV were all unreservedly positive. The garden is still doing well, so hopefully we'll be able to pick our strawberries from there next year.

And to finish with a bang, the very next week was our Reclaim the Streets. A major road in the city was blocked for 4 hours of wild music and even wilder water fights. The police were heavy-handed at first, but mellowed when they realised they couldn't win. The support of the local multicultural community was amazing - a local shoe-shop owner let us run the sound system from his shop when the generator failed, and one 72 year-old resident was out with us dancing for the whole 4 hours. Again, the press coverage was completely positive. Quote of the day - Policeman to shop owner: "Do you feel intimidated by these people?"; Shop owner: "No, I feel intimidated by you".

So, with all that, plus lively campaigns to save local allotments and trees, Leicester's had a pretty active time of it. And if anyone wants Gujarati or Bengali versions of flyers for future street parties, get in touch with LEAF.

Ashingdon Trial

The trial of the Ashingdon anti-roads protesters' is set for November, pencilled in for 8 days. The 10 protesters on trial may well be used as an example to others who oppose further development. Protesters have been on at least two sites, either Rettendon or Hockley and Ashingdon. Local residents are now taking the case to high courts to try and stop the development with the restrictive covenants. Full details : 0831 717815.

Blackpool Destruction

The residents trying to save their green public space in Blackpool were evicted this summer, only to move to another piece of the same site which was still in the hands of the Blackpool council (less well-off than Barratts).

Police were finally persuaded to investigate the wildlife genocide 5 weeks after the original criminal activity. The destruction of the site has been a harrowing experience.

Burnage Victory

Burnage residents who took direct action earlier this year to stop a mobile phone mast being erected near their homes are celebrating as Orange have been refused a request for planning permission.

People living near the site were concerned about possible health risks and had threatened to climb onto the mast should Orange have tried to put it up. However, Orange were given planning permission to use a site a mere 5 metres away back in 1997. Local residents have vowed to remain vigilant and to stop any attempt by Orange to use this site instead.

Birmingham Delays

Midland Expressway Ltd. (MEL), the company behind the first toll-motorway in Britain, are three and a half years behind schedule thanks to site occupations by protestors and the doubling of construction costs. Despite the original construction firm pulling out, MEL - bolstered by new banking loans - still plans to build a whopping 3 lane, 27 mile long bypass on greenbelt land just north of Birmingham. As well as devastating the local countryside and communities, it will also do little to ease congestion in the long term and will certainly lead the way for further greenbelt expansion.

Global Way of Action

The latest huge global day of action focussed on the IMF and World Bank summits in Prague, on September 26th. These two institutions are greatly responsible for the carnage currently visited on the world, affecting most tragically the poorest inhabitants of the poorest countries.

AROUND THE WORLD

In Belo Horizonte, Brazil, more than 200 activists sat with linked arms and blocked traffic in the entire downtown area.

Meanwhile in Sao Paulo a peaceful protest was attacked by the Civil Guard after some property damage and painting the streets. One policeman lost his head and shot his gun off, but the crowd faced him off.

In Toronto, Canada, 200 marched thru the financial district, with one person arrested for involvement in J18.

150 demonstrators also paraded anti-capitalist banners in Montreal, ending at the Stock Exchange Tower. In many ways this was a building action for the upcoming Group of 20 meeting (G-20) in Montreal this October. A "G-20 Welcoming Committee" has formed, contact stopftaa-mtl@tao.ca

Despite bad weather in Cork, Ireland, about 60 people marched to protest against capitalism and the 'deaths from Debt' today. Led by a wooden coffin, they brought a major stoppage to traffic and met a sympathetic response.

Five hundred people reclaimed the streets in Berkeley, dancing to hip hop music. California Federal Bank and McDonalds were targeted and the evening ended with small bonfires in the street.

In Florida, Anarchists dropped a Banner in Solidarity.

During the evening in Malme, Sweden, anti-imperialists smashed all the bank windows around Nydalatorget square.

Authorities banned, the planned concert against capitalism in Moscow, so instead there was a noisy demonstration with many separate meeting places. A press release mockingly promised that demonstrators would trash a McDonalds, although there was no McD nearby. 6 were arrested for carrying banners and making speeches.



The carnival against capitalism in Wellington, New Zealand, saw police attack protesters after 150 people occupied a branch of the Westpac Bank. At least 13 people were arrested and several hurt.

At Chennai, India, Human Rights-Tamil Nadu Initiative, Jubilee-2000, Tamilnadu Womens Collective and Citizens for freedom of expression jointly organised a protest of 450 persons (402 women) against the IMF and World Bank. This is just one of over 150 different mobilisations throughout the country from September 26th until October 2nd (birthday of Mahatma Ghandi) against the WTO policies.

400 turned out in Washington, USA, most of them union members and activists involved in last Spring's protests of the World Bank/IMF. They rallied in support of local parking lot attendants who are trying to unionize. 35 who sat down and blocked traffic were arrested and transported away.

Hundreds of Connecticut activists also joined forces at Bushnell Park for an unpermitted mass march.

There were two-days of action against IMF and WB in Kyiv, Ukraine, focussing on the repression happening in Prague. Worthless "IMF credits" were given out with leaflets in the street, as posters were pasted on the underground reading "More banks -- less hospitals", "Credits -- heroin, IMF -- drug-pusher" etc.

Several delegates were injured. One said: "I just want to go home."

PRAGUE

There was a mixture of phenomenal non-violent resistance and media-friendly, copycat violence in the Czech capital. Media around the globe reported how policemen were set on fire with molotov cocktails and that the beautiful cobblestones of Prague were hurled at police.

More than 65 people, including one Japanese and one Russian delegate to the conference, were injured in the clashes. Over a hundred demonstrators, drawn from all over the world, were arrested. More than 12,000 Czech police were backed up by Scotland Yard and FBI helpers.

The IMF and World Bank discussions were finished a day early, unwilling to endure the pressure of the protests any longer.

A 'counter summit' was organised by a coalition of Czech environmental, human rights and anarchist groups, called Inpega, Initiative Against Economic Globalisation. 10 days of non-violent demonstrations in the city took place, culminating on the 26th. On the preceding Saturday a 1,000 activists blocked the centre of Prague, Jubilee 2000 organised a mass funeral march and nazis and anarchists clashed at a metro tram station.

Special trains were laid on for delegates, who could still not avoid being affected by their besiegers.

"The centre has been cut off. All roads (accessible by cars) are blocked by protesters," said the congress centre's traffic and security officer Lubomir Brychta. Those inside the conference were not allowed to leave at all.

At one point protesters stormed a hotel just across the road from the congress centre. Financiers and journalists were pelted with stones until police punched them back with dogs and truncheons. Protesters also briefly blockaded the delegates again at a gala reception north of Prague's city centre.

During the night, windows were smashed, along with a limousine. Elsewhere thousands of protesters would sit down and chant 'No violence, no violence'.

A tram with thousands of activists and four considered 'non-desirable' was blocked at the Czech border, but after protests was allowed into Prague before the 26th. A contingent of 75 cyclists from

Germany had also been temporarily blocked.

It is interesting that there is an international list of "persona non grata", drawn up by a pool of police and home ministers, co-ordinated by the governments of the various countries on the payroll of international crime.

UK CROP-TRASHING

Covert Actions continue :

On 23rd August the UK's only test crop of genetically modified wheat was completely destroyed in Cambridgeshire.

Crops in Daviot, Aberdeenshire, and in Dorset and Hemel Hempstead have also been visited.

On 20th July a GM crop trial in Wivenhoe was hit in the early hours of Thursday under cover of darkness causing extensive damage. Sadly 11 people were arrested as a result.

This was only the latest of several incidents in Wivenhoe. There have also been reports of the destruction of 2 National Seed List trials of beet at Great Abingdon, and West Raynham.

Meanwhile mass open demo's have been organised in Wales, by Custodians of the Land, and by the Doncaster committee on GM crops.

In broad daylight a modest number of concerned local citizens living near Rosemaund, nr Hereford, trashed approx 10-15% of the farmscale trial site. Police moved in and arrested two of the merry harvesters after they refused to do what they were told, to cease damaging the crop and leave the field.

US CROP-TRASHING

Los Ninos del Maiz destroyed one acre of genetically modified maize the contents of four greenhouses--containing rice, maize, arabidopsis, tomatoes, tobacco and other GE lifeforms ON August 25th, leaving messages against bioimperialism.

On July 31 the Dusty Desperadoes destroyed five acres of genetically engineered canola at Monsanto facilities in Washington. Earth Liberation Front activists have also struck facilities in two different states.

On July 22nd anti-biotech direct actionists destroyed 1500 - 2000 genetically engineered trees at MEAD Corporation facilities in Maine.

Their communique read : "In an action similar to a multi-national corporate clearcut, 1500 - 2000 genetically engineered trees were hacked down."

"The creation of monoculture tree plantations breeds inherent dangers to diverse native forests & wildlife...

Toxic chemicals used on the trees create toxic soils, disturbing every ecosystem in the area and destroying any remnants of what was once natural. This technology must be destroyed, this madness must stop, and people around the world are not going to watch this unnatural synthetic culture thrive. We will continue to stand up to corporate greed."

ANIMAL FEED ACTION

On Tuesday 20th June, 17 people entered, occupied and closed the BOCM Pauls animal feed processing plant in Alton, Hampshire. BOCM Pauls is a large manufacturer of animal feed in the UK, and since 50% of all genetically modified (GM) crops are used in animal feed, this means that BOCM Pauls probably use more GM products than any other UK company.

People arrived at the front gate at 1pm, while other groups made their way to the offices and the processing plants, and another closed the gates and hung a banner reading 'Resistance is Fertile!'

In the offices the CCTV recording tape was removed and destroyed, a number of filing cabinet keys were thrown away and a 'CAPITAL' rubber stamp was stolen for future amusement. The be-suited office employees were talked to, but most expressed confusion or an antagonistic attitude. In the manufacturing plant it was different, with some of the occupiers having a cup of tea and some cool chats with the people working there - maybe next time there'll even play football!

After an hour or so four police turned up. Slightly baffled, they stopped a macho truck driver from starting a fight with people blocking the gate. After some faffing they gave a deadline - leave or be arrested. There was an impromptu get together, they they were given the occupiers decision - that they would stay until 4.30pm and leave then, not before. And that's what happened. No arrests.

PIE THE PRIME MINISTER

Canadian Prime Minister Jean Chretien received a cream pie on August 16th. The pie thrower was arrested, taken to the Charlottetown Police Station, charged with assault, and released.

GENETIX SNOWBALL

GenetiX Snowball campaigners have been convicted of aggravated trespass for openly pulling up genetically modified (GM) crops in August last year. The magistrate did not accept that the campaigners held the honest belief that they were acting to prevent a crime when they pulled up the GM crops. These are the first convictions for aggravated trespass (trespass which interferes with a lawful activity) against GM campaigners although the charge has been repeatedly used against anti-roads protesters.

GREENPEACE TRIAL

Greenpeace have received a total acquittal, however, for the damage they did to GM maize last year.

Lord Melchett and his fellow protesters, were acquitted at a retrial at Norwich crown court after claiming they had lawful excuse to attack the crop at a farm in Lyng, Norfolk, in July 1999.

At the original trial in April the 28 were cleared of theft, but the jury was unable to reach a verdict on criminal damage. Now they have been awarded costs for both trials of an estimated £250,000.

The aim of removing the entire crop was crucial to the defence case. The protesters argued that they had lawful excuse under the Criminal Damage Act 1971 to uproot the crop, as leaving it to flower and pollinate would have led to a greater crime - the contamination of other crops in the vicinity.

While police are determined for this not to set a precedent, the NFU has announced it is now 'open season' for anti-GM perverts to trash GM crops, or something.



Ilisu Dam

Of the many harebrained and devastating dam and development projects in the world, the Ilisu Dam is one of the most urgent and tragic. As part of a war of genocide against the Kurds, the Turkish government plans to flood the Kurdish heartlands. Kurds are being evicted at gunpoint, their villages raised to the ground. The 10,000 year old city of Hasankeyf will be destroyed.

The Ilisu Dam will enable Turkey to control the flow of the Tigris, thus enabling Turkey to deny water to Iraq and Syria : a potential trigger point for the next Middle East War. The UK government will be providing the funding.

Prime contractors will be Balfour Beatty, backed by the British taxpayer to the tune of 200 million. This is one of the ways in which taxpayer's money is transferred to large corporations.

The UK (particularly Farnborough-based BAE systems) is also a major supplier of arms to Turkey, regularly turning a blind eye to human rights abuses. Please take action.

CIA in Oakington

As part of a day of action in Cambridge on August 19th, around 200 people showed up at Oakington (the latest refugee prison) with musical instruments and materials to decorate the fences and give gifts of toys, sweets, books and clothes to fill an entire van. Two people (one dressed as a pink and green furry monster!) were allowed to go into the centre and hand in the gifts. The children were delighted, especially with the chocolate!

Police were there in force, with helicopter, patrols and a roadblock 100 metres up the lane that shields the detention centre from the outside world. People were read the Public Disorder Act, and with police photographers in full body armour and the occasional police helicopter, there was an atmosphere of intimidation.

Groups had gathered as part of the Cambridge-wide action Cambridge In August (CIA) which targeted the Oakington Detention Centre, Trinity College (which has major share-holdings in arms manufacturer British Aerospace) and nearby Huntington Life Sciences (Europe's largest and most notorious animal experimentation facility) all on the same day.

In August, a taxi carrying racist shadow home secretary Ann Widdecombe from a book-signing in Edinburgh was surrounded by angry protesters, enraged by her attitude towards asylum seekers. Police forced a way out through the placard-wielding crowd, after she was heckled with chants of "Jail the racists, not the refugees!" and "Refugees are welcome, Widdecombe is not." At a previous book-signing in Oxford she was pelted with custard pies.

7 protesters who blocked the road outside Oakington detention centre on the day it opened, have been convicted. The charge was maliciously changed from obstruction of the highway to obstruction of a police officer when police evidence collapsed.

Join the Civil Rights Caravan

- * Full rights for asylum-seekers, undocumented workers, migrants, and victims of racist attacks

The Caravan will link up with a series of events being planned across the country, such as protests at Campsfield Detention Centre

3 LEGS GOOD, ARMAGEDDON BAD

On August 1st, over 80 people were arrested at Faslane submarine base for blocking access to it for several hours. Dozens of people, including Buddhist monks and nuns, had walked there from Aldermaston on a Peace March. A 20-foot tripod, housing two people, kept the South Gate blocked all day and into the evening. Meanwhile at Coulport base, a few miles away, activists from the Trident Ploughshares two-week summer camp climbed and cut the fences. Three women sat for six hours on top of Coulport's main gate while two others swam two miles down the loch to within yards of trident. Trident Ploughshares activists have been found "not guilty" by juries for openly and accountably trashing Trident property.

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
